Intruder Detection Systems, CCTV and Lighting Perimeter IDS, building IDS (passive and active, shell and volumetric), access route monitoring cameras (overt, covert, fixed, PTZ), CCTV transmission and storage, video motion detection, remote monitoring, security lighting (infrared and visible)

Manpower, Procedures and Emergencies Staff vetting and recruitment, job descriptions, basic training design, manpower deployment, manpower in an electronic security environment, patrolling, incident reporting, standard operating procedures, emergency protection against explosive devices, protection of at-risk personnel, half-day syndicated security design exercise

An Introduction to Investigation By means of an exercise, this compact session will address the main points to be borne in mind when conducting an internal investigation into suspected crime, including how to protect a scene of suspected crime

Security of Information and IT Systems Information threats and sources, information at risk, industrial espionage, employee monitoring, protection of data (hard copy and electronic), waste disposal, communications security, email intercept, computer component theft, laptop security, network security, internet uses and abuses, data storage and back-up, IT contingency, hacking and denial of service attacks, virus protection, data encryption, creating an information and IT security policy
